### Freedom and its limitations

#### Extract 1

##### The importance of individual freedom and tolerance

No society in which liberties are not, on the whole, respected, is free, and no society is completely free where liberties exist absolute and unqualified. The only freedom which deserves the name is that of pursuing our own good in our own way, so long as we do not attempt to deprive others of theirs, or impede their efforts to obtain it. Each is the proper guardian of his own health, whether bodily, or mental or spiritual. Mankind are greater gainers by suffering each other to live as seems good to themselves, than by compelling each to live as seems good to the rest.

#### Extract 2

##### Social discrimination and freedom

There is no denying that there has been and is still discrimination on the basis of gender and of race. Furthermore, in a time of economic stress, there's a danger of women and people of colour becoming scapegoats. But I do believe that access to employment and earning is key; once that's in place, many of the social problems are relieved.

There's no question that the black middle class has benefited greatly by the civil rights movement. But there is a large black underclass that still does not have access to jobs. If there's no clear road to income and status except crime, we should expect social problems. You can't solve this problem without addressing the economic issues, and the same is true with gender.
